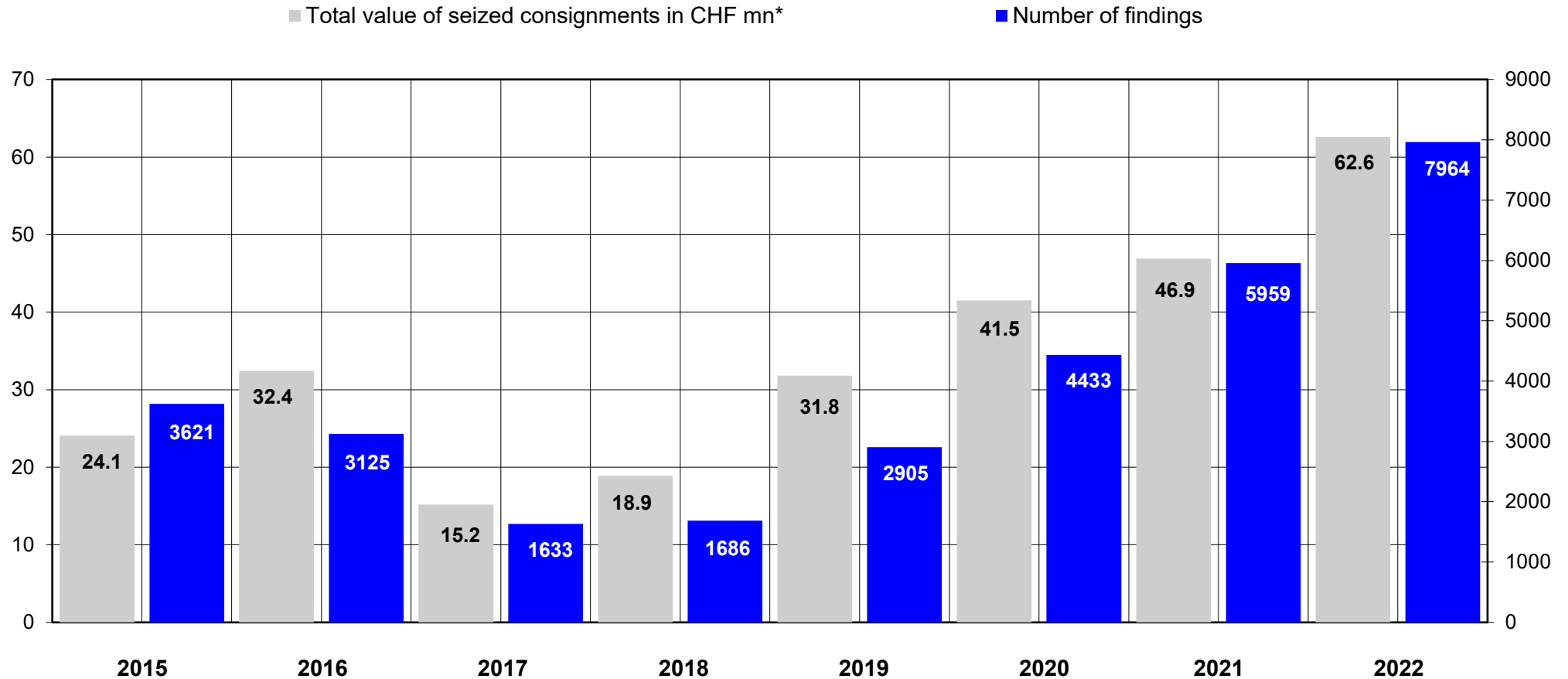

I. Commercial import, export and transit (incl. mail and courier consignments)

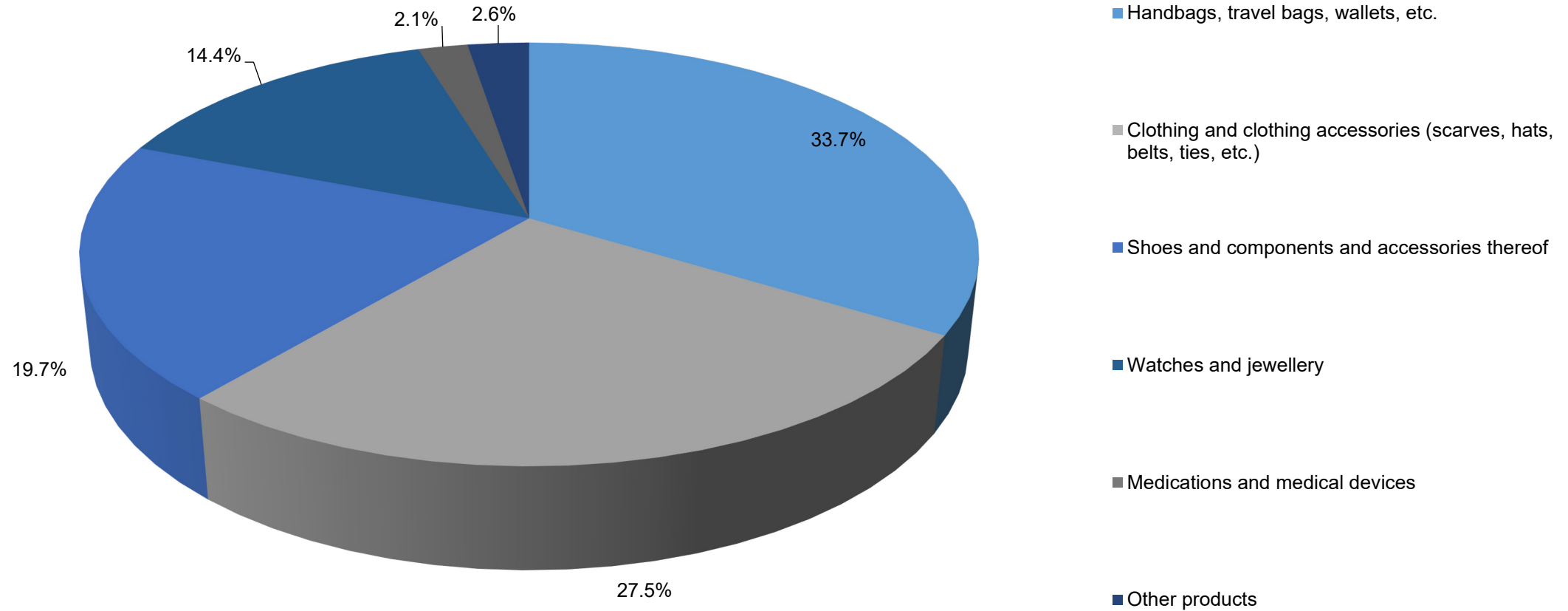

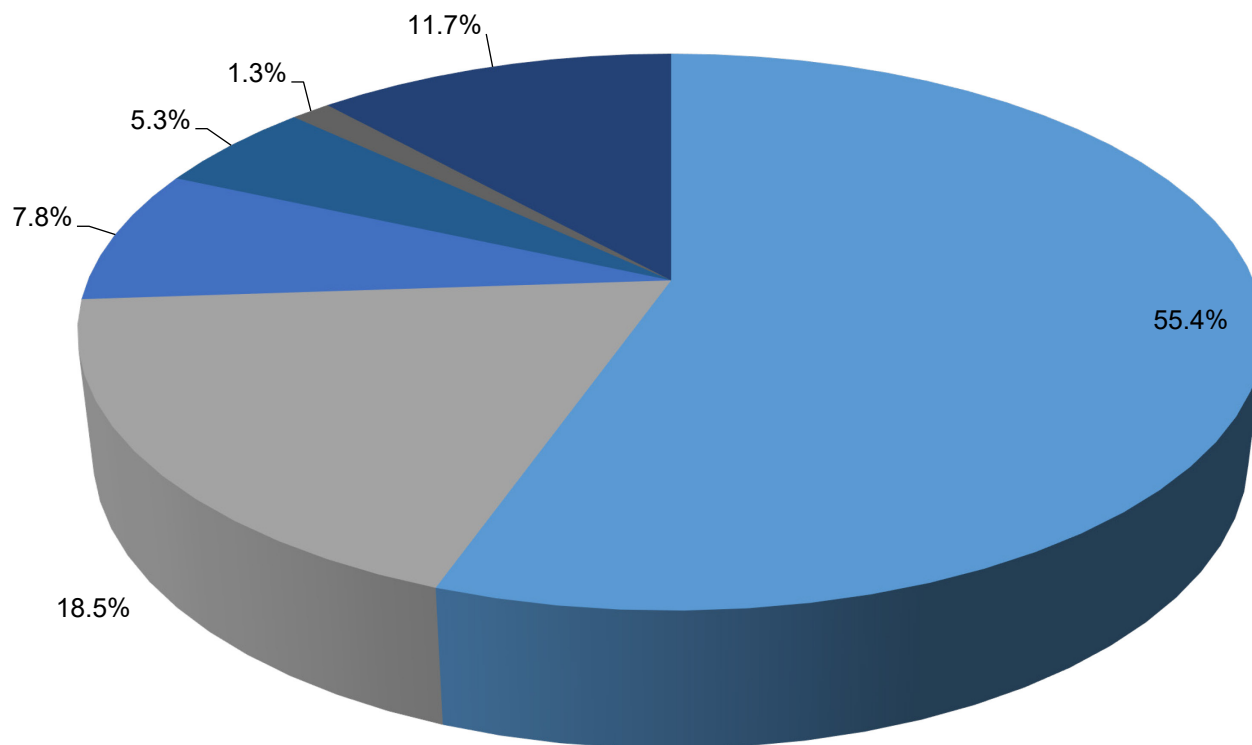

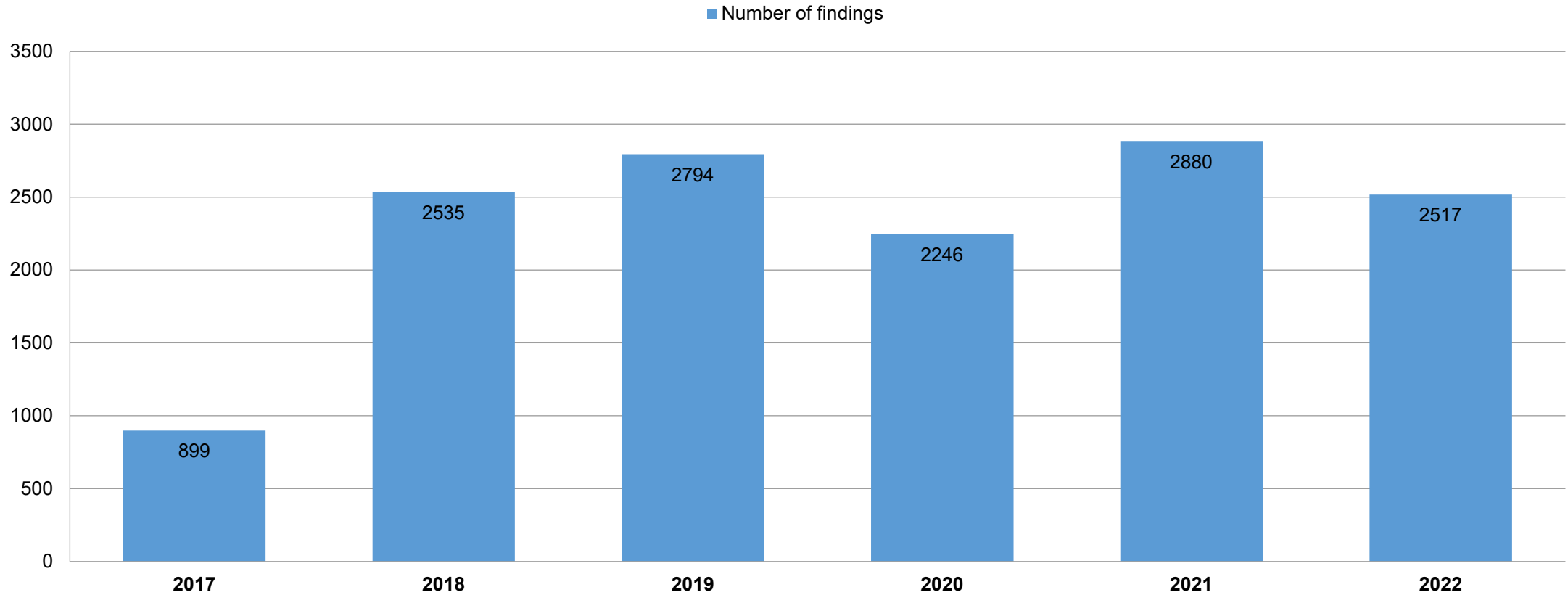

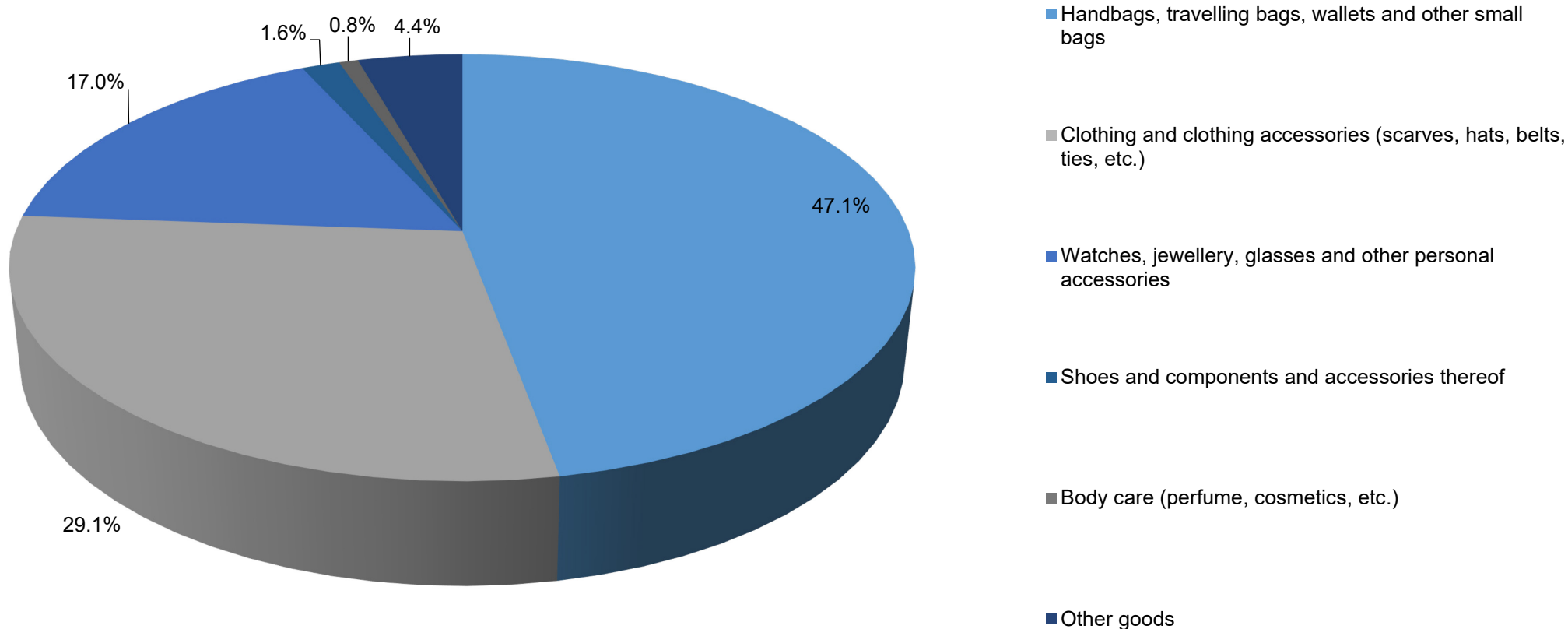

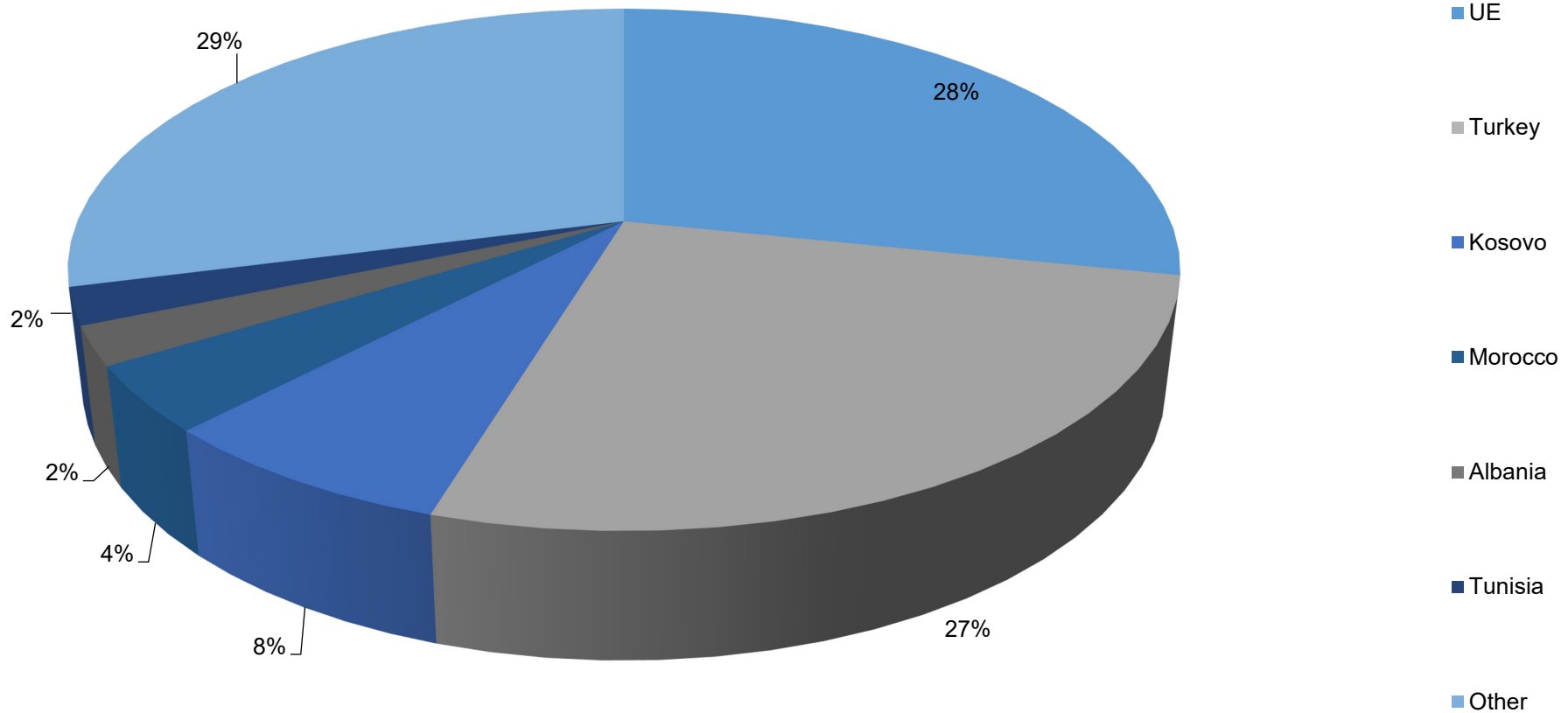
Findings by categories of goods (tourist traffic)
